# **SNAP** Giardia Test

## What to do with your SNAP® Giardia Test result

### Positive result

In dogs and cats with clinical signs there is evidence Giardia may be the cause of diarrhea

### **Negative result**

Giardia is unlikely the cause of clinical signs

## What to do next?

 Consider concurrent intestinal parasite infections perform fecal O&P with fecal antigen testing Fecal Dx Profile—Test Code FDXP



## **Treat**

- Treat with a giardicidal drug for use in dogs and cats
- Bathe the infected animal
- Decontaminate the animal's environment with a disinfectant

- Retesting is not recommended if clinical signs resolve
- If clinical signs persist, consider other causes of diarrhea perform Diarrhea RealPCR Panel—Comprehensive
  Canine—Test Code CDCD
  Feline—Test Code FDCD



## **Prevent**

- Appropriate disposal of pet fecal material
- Routine vaccination of all pets for Giardia is not recommended

 Consider concurrent intestinal parasite infections—perform fecal O&P with fecal antigen testing

 Consider other possible causes of diarrhea—perform Diarrhea RealPCR™ Panel— Comprehensive Canine—Test Code CDCD Feline—Test Code FDCD
